THE WHY & HOW OF SHARING OUR FAITH

"Almost all practicing Christians believe that part of their faith means being a witness about Jesus (ranging from 95% to 97% among all generational groups), and that the best thing that could ever happen to someone is for them to know Jesus (94% to 97%)... Despite this, many Millennials are unsure about the actual practice of evangelism. Almost half of Millennials (47%) agree at least somewhat that it is wrong to share one's personal beliefs with someone of a different faith in hopes that they will one day share the same faith."

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The foundation of Evangelism is based on the <u>Lordship</u> of Christ.




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Our outline consists of two main points...

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.."

Matthew 28:18



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So...what <u>authority</u> does Jesus have?



"But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins..." (Mathew 9:6)

"Pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:38)

"I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 16:18-19)

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me..."

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(Matthew 28:18)

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent." (Colossians 1:15-18)

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"..far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church."

(Ephesians 1:21-22)

"God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (Philippians 2:9-10)


THE WHY & HOW OF SHARING OUR FAITH

- "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God." (John 1:12-13)
- → We take hold of this commission because there is only One who has the authority to tell us to "go".
- → His Authority produces confidence in us.



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- Verse 18 brings us relief...

"And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."

- We are freed from confidence in ourselves...we need to cherish the doctrine of Christ's authority in our evangelism.



"Obedience to the Great Commission isn't a man-made program, nor is it our own willpower that leads us to go. Jesus's authority compels us to go, for missions only makes sense if He has all authority in heaven and on earth. However, we don't go reluctantly, as if we're being forced to follow just any king. His worth is the fuel of our mission."

The Presence of Christ

- "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20
- → Jesus promises His presence!
- "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us)." (Matthew 1:23)

- Missional Success is based on Christ's presence through His Spirit.


"(Jesus)...is able to do far more abundantly than we can ask, think, or imagine through his power at work within us..." (Ephesians 3:20)



The Presence of Christ

-Successful Evangelism is faithfulness...

→ We take a step of faith in the power of the Holy Spirit and we leave the outcome to God!
