

Spatial Aspect: Separated, set apart

Moral Aspect: Devoted to God's glory

Two Indicative Statements

1. The unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God.

Two Indicative Statements

2. Believers have been made holy

And such <u>were</u> some of you. But <u>you were washed, you were</u> <u>sanctified, you were justified</u> in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.



You Were Washed

"...wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow."
Psalm 51:7b

You Were Sanctified

Set apart as God's holy children

Restored to a wonderful purpose

You shall be holy to me, for I the LORD am holy and have separated you from the peoples, that you should be mine.
Leviticus 20:26




You Were Justified

To render a favorable verdict

...you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

1 Corinthians 6:11b





- We have "a holy calling" (2 Tim 1:9)
- We have been "set apart as holy" (2 Tim 2:21)
- We have been chosen to "be holy" (Eph 1:4)
- We are "God's chosen ones, holy and beloved" (Col 3:12)
- We are described as "a holy priesthood" (1 Peter 2:5), "a holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9), and a holy temple (1 Cor 3:17; Eph 2:21)
- We are repeatedly referred to as "saints" or holy ones

Definitive Sanctification

A once-for-all act of God, by which believers are set apart as holy in union with Christ.

Progressive Sanctification

The ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in the believer's life, conforming them more and more into the likeness of Christ through a gradual process.



In Christ, you are holy

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession...

1 Peter 2:9

In Christ, you have a responsibility to pursue holiness

Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, <u>bringing holiness to</u> completion in the fear of God.

2 Corinthians 7:1

Problem #1 - We Want God But Not Holiness

Apathetic or even negative attitude towards holiness and obedience

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <u>teaching them to observe (obey/keep) all that I have</u>

commanded you.

Matthew 28:19-20a



Problem #2 - We Want Holiness But Not God

- Think it is mainly about obeying rules and being a good person
- There are various reasons to obey rules besides pleasing God
- True holiness is about devotion to the Lord



Three Ways the Church Helps Us Grow in Holiness

1. The preaching and teaching of God's Word Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. John 17:17

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:16-17

Three Ways the Church Helps Us Grow in Holiness

- 2. <u>Discipling Relationships (Intentional Spiritual Friendships)</u>
 Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.
- 1 Corinthians 11:1

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Three Ways the Church Helps Us Grow in Holiness

3. Sacraments - Baptism & the Lord's Supper

We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.
