Melvin D. Bodtke

Melvin D. Bodtke was given life by his creator on February 9, 1936, in Gilead to Walter and Lydia (Gerberding) Bodtke. Melvin received the gift of baptism and became a child of God on February 23, 1936, and he publicly confessed his baptismal faith and was confirmed, both at Trinity Lutheran Church, in Gilead, Nebraska. He enjoyed playing cards, tinkering, spending time with friends and taking videos.

On Friday, March 1, 2024, at Bryan Medical Center East in Lincoln. Melvin D. Bodtke, at 88 years of age, was blessed by God with a holy death, and God graciously took him home to rest in the arms of Jesus to await the resurrection of the dead.
