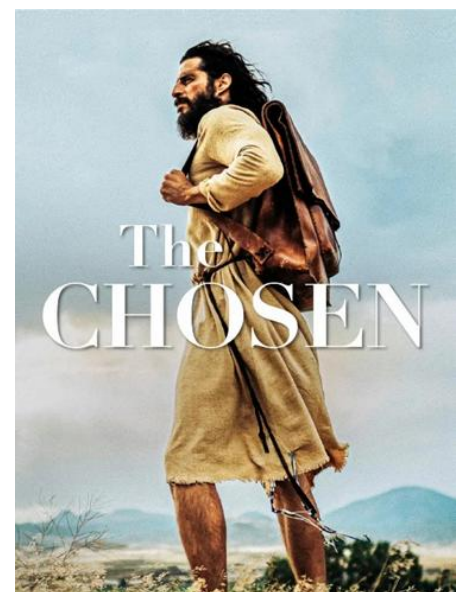

Set in 1st-century Galilee, the series centers on the life, ministry, and miracles of Jesus Christ as recorded in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The production team has taken some creative liberties with conversations, settings, and non-scriptural interactions to connect the historical events of the Bible into a continuous drama.

They note that the show is a companion piece designed to send viewers back to the Bible to read for themselves, and it is not to



replace scripture. Each Sunday, we'll watch one episode, lasting 40-55 minutes, followed by a short discussion.
