Session #1 – Marriage on THE Rock



Matthew 7:24-25

Video: Super Marriage Tips

Building your marriage upon the instructions of the Bible is building your marriage on the Rock, Jesus Christ.

1. Introduction

- A good marriage is difficult to maintain
- Men and women both have needs and desires Ephesians 5:33
 - 1. The primary desire of a woman is to feel loved
 - 2. The primary desire of a man is to feel respected
- Men and women both hear, see, and speak differently
 - 1. "Blue" and "pink" hearing aids, glasses, and megaphones
- I want us to look at some things that Lisa and I have found to be very helpful in having and maintaining a good marital relationship.

2. The Integrity of Our Commitment

- Commitment to the duration of marriage
 - 1. We each vowed, "For better or for worse, in sickness or in health, till death do us part." Jesus said, "What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." (Mark 10:9)
 - 2. There is integrity in our character. "Integrity" means, "an unimpaired condition, honesty, adherence to a code of moral values."

- Commitment to fidelity in marriage.
 - 1. Getting and being married means that you will have no liaisons, physical encounters, infidelity, or emotional intrigue or bonding with the opposite sex.

3. Seriousness about Our Biblical Roles

- Every husband is to love his wife Ephesians 5:33
 - 1. As our own body -5:28
 - 2. As Christ loves the church -5:25
 - 1. Prophet represent God before the family
 - 2. Priest represent the family before God
 - 3. King ensure provision and protection
- Wives are to submit their wills to their husband
 - 1. As unto the Lord -5:22
 - 2. Respect him rather than tearing him down (Men, be worthy of that respect).
- Submitting yourselves to one another (Ephesians 5:20) is a commitment to keep your lives on THE Rock.
- Practicalities
 - 1. Husbands, lead in everything
 - 1. Make decision upon good counsel from your wife
 - 2. Lead in all areas from being the first to apologize to being the first to support
 - 2. Wives, encourage in everything
 - 1. A woman who refuses to reverence her husband will eventually dominate him and cause him to become resentful
 - 2. Loving feelings follow loving actions
 - 3. The day-in and day-out realities of marriage are accomplished only in the power of the Holy Spirit Ephesians 5:18

4. Learn to enjoy each other

- This is the idea of "companionship" that Malachi 2:14 speaks of.
 - 1. Marriage was never intended to be the sharing of two careers, two incomes, two plans and one house.
 - 2. Rather, marriage is the sharing of two lives together.
 - 3. "Leave and cleave" is referenced four times in the Scriptures.
- Do things together
 - 1. Work at developing interests in the same things
 - 2. Write 10 things to do together

• Some activities were just never really designed to be enjoyed as husband and wife (e.g. men and women shop VERY differently).

5. Have open and honest communication

- To have the kind of love and respect we are to have for one another, there must be open and honest communications (Ephesians 5:21)
 - 1. That means speaking AND listening
- Marriage is no place for secrets

6. Learn to laugh together – Proverbs 17:22

- Laughter is a daily requirement in marriage.
- "The most wasted of all days is the one without laughter." E.E. Cummings
- Learn to laugh and have fun together. "All the days of the afflicted are evil: but he that is of a merry heart hath a continual feast (Proverbs 15:15).
- Marriage without joy is like a wagon without springs...

Your marriage is worth saving.

Recommit today to giving your best, regardless of your situation.

Jesus is the Rock we all need to build our marriage upon. It takes two people to choose to have a marriage on THE Rock. It only takes one person to choose to have a marriage on the rocks.

Change is possible (John 17:17) and solutions are available (2 Timothy 3:16-17)!!!

1. Major Problem Areas

- Some problems all couples face
 - 1. Squeezing a tube of toothpaste
 - 2. A wife's cold feet in bed
 - 3. A husband's dirty socks
 - 4. Negative cash flow
 - 5. Installing toilet paper
- Other marriage problems
 - 1. Self-centeredness 2 Timothy 3:2
 - 2. Sexual infidelity (Adultery & Pornography)
 - 3. In-Laws (Out Laws?)
 - 4. Empty nest syndrome
 - 5. Lack of self-control
 - 6. Wrong priorities
 - 7. Indebtedness
 - 8. Disciplining children
 - 9. Spirituality / Spiritual desires
 - 10.Poor communication
 - 11.Insecurities / Baggage from Past Relationships or Family of Origin

2. How to Resolve Marriage Problems

- Resolving marriage problems presupposes:
 - 1. Marriage holy before God
 - 2. Problems every family has them
 - 3. Resolution to resolve you have the desire to fix the problems
 - 4. An acceptable approach to resolve marriage problems:
 - ➤ Unacceptable ways:
 - Calling your mother-in-law and telling her she can have your wife back! (involving a 3rd party in your marriage)
 - Take an overdose of buttermilk and end it all (food therapy)
 - Take an extended vacation after he leaves for work (abandonment)
 - Continue in your present condition and see who can be the most miserable (refusing to change / ignoring the problem / hoping the other one changes. Btw, the deadline for the Guinness Book of World Records is December 27th)
 - Acceptable method is the biblical vehicle of communication
- Marriage is a "Covenant of Companionship" Malachi 2:14
 - 1. Your covenant explicitly requires an agreement to meet your spouse's needs for companionship sexually, socially, and spiritually.
 - 2. Your covenant is for the rest of your life and, therefore, your covenant is final.
 - ➤ What you have sitting beside you is all you get!
 - > Take it or take it, but you cannot leave it!
- Principles to follow in resolving problems through communication
 - 1. Identify your problems
 - 2. Remember, you are looking for a resolution, *not* a winner. (Galatians 6:1)
 - 3. Examine your problem in light of the Scripture 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - Always have the mindset that you will abide by whatever the Bible says
 - If you do not see the answer in precept, look for it in principle

- Be honest with your evaluation and application of Scripture
- 4. Build up the other (Ephesians 4:29) even in the midst of problems
 - > Speak kindly and lovingly
 - ➤ Use no harsh words remember you have to live together after dealing with the problem.
- 5. Attack the problem only, not each other. Anger has no place in problem solving. (Philippians 4:2)
- 6. Seek pastoral counseling if you can't get your problems resolved in a couple of days. (Philippians 4:3)
 - ➤ Pastoral counseling provides aid to resolve a problem by sifting it through Scripture in order to provide God's solution
- 7. Be forgiving (Ephesians 4:32)
 - > "I won't bring it up again, to you or to anyone else"
- 8. Remember, love endures! (1 Corinthians 13:4-7). Also, the Bible states that, "Love covers the multitude of sins." (1 Peter 4:8)
- 9. Don't go to bed with unresolved problems (Ephesians 4:26)
- 10. End all problem-solving times with a hug and a kiss. (1 Peter 3:7)
