**Ephesians 2:1-7** focuses primarily on redemption in Christ. The text vividly describes the unbeliever's standing before God as evidenced by his unfruitful walk through the world. In continuation from chapter 1, the text presents God's willingness and ability to extend grace to change the nature, standing, and purpose of the born-again believer (1:3-10, 17-20). In the section immediately preceding (1:15-23), the apostle's prayer describes the wisdom and power of God in salvation that becomes effectual through Jesus Christ in chapter 2 (2:5-6, 8-22). The passage identifies further the blessings of one's position "in Christ" (1:1, 3, 10, 12, 20; cf. 2:10, 13) and prepares the reader for deeper discussions regarding the consequences of worldly living in subsequent passages (5:1-14). Also, the teaching of salvation by grace is introduced in 2:5 and further explained in 2:8-10. The redemption described in 2:1-7 is further compounded with Paul's explanation of the restoration that also results from salvation.
