<p><i>Accountability and Celebration</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● For those of you who didn't know your calling last week, did you spend time listening to God in prayer, silence, or by reading your Bible? Tell the group if God led you in anything. ● If you know your calling in life, how did you dive deeper into that calling the past week? <p><i>Prayer</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Pray for our hearts to be aligned with God's and His calling. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Ephesians 2:13-22</p> <p><i>What does the passage say?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● What words does Paul use to describe our relationship to God and His Kingdom before Christ came? And what words does he use to describe us after Christ? (v.19) ● In the final verses of the chapter it talks about us growing up and growing into the Temple of God. What does that mean? Why is the significant for our life before we die and go into the presence of God? <p><i>What does it say about God?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● If Christ IS our peace rather than just the person who gives us peace, what does that mean? (v. 14) 	<p><i>Practice</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Take a few minutes to pause and pray, repeating to yourselves, "Jesus you don't just give me peace, you are my peace." Some people call this a "breath prayer." You can breathe in praying "Jesus you don't just give me peace" and then as you breathe out you can pray to yourself "you are my peace." <p><i>Plan</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Attempt this at least once during the week for five minutes. ● Ask someone in the group to message you during the week to ask you how it went.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Pray that our primary calling would be to take up our cross daily and follow Jesus.● Pray for clarity for our secondary callings and for vision on what that could look like.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● How did Jesus destroy the hostility we had between us and God? (v.13, 16) <p><i>What does it say about us?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Based on what Jesus did on earth (life, death, and resurrection), who do we now have access to? (The Father in v.18)● Notice v.22 actually talks about us not only having the Holy Spirit inside us individually, but more importantly together as the Body of Christ. Why is this important to notice?	
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
