 How are you guys walking out your spiritual maturity lately? What would you like to improve on and what are some wins during this journey? Prayer	It wasn't until the 4th century AD that Christians were able to live without fear of death. This letter was most likely written between 60-65 AD (or as late as 80) and so this was a very tricky time for the Christians spread out all over the place. In fact, the main way that Christians were see in the public eye was when they were discovered and then gruesomely killed in front of lots of people by burning them, beheading them, or by letting lions eat them. And yet they still confessed Christ till the end. What does this teach us about ourselves as Christians in the 21st century?
