What does this text teach us about God?

- Although the creation of these enemies was Israel's fault, what do we see God through these leaders? (They complete the temple)

(The prophets Haggai and Zechariah told them to rebuild it! This teach us that he speaks through his word. In the OT his word passed through prophets, now it passes through his written scriptures!)
