Matthew 11:16-17

¹⁶ "But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to their playmates,

¹⁷ 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn.'"



Matthew 11:18–19

¹⁸ "For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' ¹⁹ The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds."



The Parable (11:16–17)

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1. Repentance is too hard and humbling (11:18)

¹⁸ "For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon."



Matthew 3:2

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."



2. Grace is too free and joyful (11:19)

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Matthew 4:17

From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."



Deuteronomy 21:20-21

²⁰ ...and they shall say to the elders of his city, 'This our son is stubborn and rebellious; he will not obey our voice; he is **a glutton and a drunkard**.' ²¹ Then all the men of the city shall stone him to death with stones.



<u>Luke 15:1–2</u>

¹ Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."



Luke 19:5–7

⁵ And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." ⁶ So he hurried and came down and received him joyfully. ⁷ And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."



Matthew 9:10–13

¹⁰ And as Jesus reclined at the table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples. ¹¹ And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹² But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ ... For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."



2. Grace is too free and joyful (11:19)
