



D. Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*, pp. 17–19:

“It is not simply to be taken for granted that the Christian has the privilege of living among other Christians....It is by the grace of God that a congregation is permitted to gather visibly in this world to share God’s Word and sacrament. Not all Christians receive this blessing. The imprisoned, the sick, the scattered lonely, the proclaimers of the Gospel in heathen lands stand alone. They know that visible fellowship is a blessing....**The physical presence of other Christians is a source of incomparable joy and strength to the believer....**”

WILLIAM TYNDALE'S 1526 TRANSLATION OF HEBREWS 10:25

and **let us not forsake the felishippe** that we have amonge oure selves as the manner of some is: but let us exhorte one another and that so moche the more because ye see that the daye draweth nye.

“Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations for my name’s sake. And then many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, ***the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.***”
