- James, a **servant** of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ (Jas 1:1)
- Simon Peter, a **servant** and apostle of Jesus Christ (2 Pet 1:1)
- Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ (Jude 1)



Galatians 1:10

2. Renew your aspirations (10:25a)

The aspiration of the disciple and slave is to be like the teacher and master, nothing more. Suffering persecution like Jesus is thus a privilege. Jesus's disciples should be honored to share even in his sufferings.

❖ The goal of church activity is to make believers like Christ (Eph 4:13)

❖ God's purpose in our suffering is to make believers like Christ (James 1:2−4)
