




What is expository preaching?

Expository preaching explains and applies the intended meaning of a biblical text through careful study of its grammar, context, and background, in light of the whole Bible, fulfilled in Christ, with the help of God's Spirit.







12 Benefits of Expository Preaching

- 1. Expository preaching teaches people "the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27).
- 2. Expository preaching equips people to study Scripture themselves.
- 3. Expository preaching glorifies Christ as the center of Scripture.
- 4. Expository preaching protects churches from a leader's hobbyhorses.
- 5. Expository preaching upholds Scripture's authority over anyone else's.
- 6. Expository preaching compels us to address hard or unpopular topics.



12 Benefits of Expository Preaching

- 7. Expository preaching cultivates loving unity in the truth of the gospel.
- 8. Expository preaching fosters theological depth and spiritual stability.
- 9. Expository preaching enriches our prayer, fellowship, and evangelism.
- 10. Expository preaching forms a filter that can discern false teaching.
- 11. Expository preaching creates a hunger for meat and not just milk.
- 12. Expository preaching sanctifies the church through God's word and Spirit.
