Shotgun Sheep

Matthew 26:30-31

30 And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. **31** Then Jesus said to them, “You will all fall away because of me this night. For it is written, ‘I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.’



Shotgun Sheep

Matthew 26:33-35

33 Peter answered him, “Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall away.” **34** Jesus said to him, “Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times.”

35 Peter said to him, “Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you!” And all the disciples said the same.



Shotgun Sheep Stumble

The Steadfast Shepherd Saves

The Steadfast Shepherd Saves

Zechariah 13:7-9

7 “Awake, O sword, against my shepherd,
against the man who stands next to me,”
declares the Lord of hosts.
“Strike the shepherd,
and the sheep will be scattered;
I will turn my hand against the little ones.



The Steadfast Shepherd Saves

Zechariah 13:7-9

8 In the whole land, declares the Lord,
two thirds shall be cut off and perish,
and one third shall be left alive.



The Steadfast Shepherd Saves

Zechariah 13:7-9

9 And I will put this third into the fire,
and refine them as one refines silver,
and test them as gold is tested.



The Steadfast Shepherd Saves

They will call upon my name,

#2 | THE STEADFAST SHEPHERD

Matthew 26:31b-32



THE STEADFAST SHEPHERD

• • •

stays to be struck down for his sheep, standing against and rising victorious over death itself so that he might save the sheep of his flock.



THE TAKE AWAY

#1: Shotgun Sheep... celebrates and commemorates God's deliverance and redemption of Israel from slavery in Egypt so that they might belong to Him.

#2: The Steadfast Shepherd... demonstrates both our need for a greater, ultimate Passover and God's sovereign grace in providing it.



CONCLUSION

Shotgun Sheep are faithless, but the Steadfast Shepherd is faithful to save us anyway.
