Hebrews 2:10-18

Made Perfect through Suffering

- Suffering plays a key part in God's plan
- Thru it, Jesus was made a suitable Savior

Security through Suffering

- The "everyone" for whom Jesus died are <u>those that experience</u> <u>salvation</u>
- Jesus <u>rightly fits God's people</u> for the journey to Glory
- Our family relationship was <u>ordained by the Father</u> and <u>secured</u> by the Son

Identification through Suffering

- Jesus assumed the limitations of humanity
- Not only did He come, but He came to deliver and restore
- Jesus lived out <u>the human experience</u>

Propitiation through Suffering

- Fashioned to be merciful, proven to be faithful
- In His obedience and sacrifice He <u>turned away wrath</u> and satisfied justice

For Life Group Discussion

Hebrews 2:10-18

- 1. Have you ever wrestled with the pervasive nature of suffering? How? What are some explanations you've heard about God and the reality of suffering?.
- 2. Read Heb 2:9 and Phil 2: 5-11. What is the relationship between Jesus' suffering and His exaltation?
- 3. Read Heb 2:9-13, and note all that Jesus has accomplished for the many "sons & daughters" that God is brining to glory. Based on these texts, on what basis are we secure in our salvation?
- 4. Read Gen 3:15; Isa 7:14; Jn 1:14; Gal 4:4; Phil 2:7-8; and Heb 2:14-16. How are these verses related? How do they help prepare your heart for the celebration of Christmas?
- 5. Read Rom 3:25; Heb 2:17; 1 Jn 2:2; and 1 Jn 4:10 in several translations, including the ESV. How do you understand "propitiation"? Is it worth maintaining "Bible words," even if we have to consistently explain them?
- 6. As you go through suffering, what difference does it make that Jesus shares that experience? How does His suffering compare with yours? And what did God accomplish through His suffering?

Homework: Read Hebrews 3:1-6 in preparation for next Sunday
