Mark 11:12-25

Hypocrisy is a Form of Faithlessness

(Mark 11:12-19)

- The metaphor of the Fig Tree
 - * Faithless temple worship was all leaves and no fruit
 - * We must guard our hearts against empty religion
- Hypocrisy always leads to <u>corruption</u>

The Foundation of Authentic Faith

(Mark 11:20-25)

- Authentic faith has God as its object
 - * We don't have <u>faith in faith</u>, but <u>faith in a person</u>
- Authentic faith is <u>expressed in a willingness to forgive</u>

How do the truths in this passage apply to me?

- 1. As Christians, how do we guard against the temptation toward hypocrisy?
- 2. Compare Ezekiel 37:15-19, Jerimiah 18:1-6; & Acts 21-10-12 with Mark 11:12-14 & 20-21. Is Jesus acting as a prophet? Are there other scriptures that refer to Him as a Prophet?
- 3. The statement was made "hypocrisy always leads to corruption," citing the misuse of the Court of the Gentiles as proof. Can you think of any contemporary examples?
- 4. Read Mark 11:20-25. Were you surprised that Jesus responded to Peter's statement with a teaching about faith, forgiveness, and prayer instead of an explanation about the fig tree?
- 5. How do you understand the promises of Mark 11:23 & 24 in light of verses such as Mark 11:22, Psalm 62:8, and John 14:1?
- 6. Read Mark 11:25, Matthew 5:7, 6:9-15, 7:2, 18:21-35 & James 2:13. What is the relationship between our willingness to forgive and the authenticity of our faith?
