What the Signs WOULD NOT Be

(Mark 13:5-13)

- Don't be misled by current events
- Opposition and persecution <u>are normal</u>

What the Signs WOULD Be

(Mark 13:14-23)

- The Abomination of Desolation is the key event in both the short-term and long-term fulfillment
- Forewarned is forearmed

The Coming of the Son of Man

(Mark 13:24-27)

• The complete fulfillment of <u>all God's promises</u> throughout the centuries

Final Exhortations

(Mark 13:28-37)

- Although all else will fade and fail, <u>Jesus' words</u> will endure for eternity
- Therefore, be on guard, keep awake

For Life Group Discussion

Mark 13

- 1. Read Mark 13. What stands out? How did Sunday's message help clarify things for you? What questions do you still have, or what continues to cause confusion?
- 2. Had you heard of the principle of dual fulfillment before? How can this interpretive tool better help us understand prophetic passages like Mark 13? Look at 2 Sam 7:11-13, Luke 1:32-33, Mat 16:18, Rev 21:2, and Matt 12:42 for a helpful example.
- 3. Why do you think we are so prone to interpret current events or the rejection of Christian values as a sign of the end times? How do Jesus words in Mark 13:5-13 help us keep them in context?
- 4. What are the signs that the return of Christ is near, according to Mark 13:14-23? How have you heard these interpreted? What other passages can we look to for help?
- 5. Compare Mark 13:24-27 with Isa 13:10,; 24:23; 34:4; Eze 32:7-8; Joel 2:10, 30-31; 3:15; Amos 8:9; Dan 7:13; Deut 30:4; and Zech 2:6. What should we conclude from the continuity we see in these passages?
- 6. Based on everything you heard in Sunday's message, what practical difference will the imminent return of Christ make in your life today? Be specific.
