Challenges from the Opposition

(Mark 12:13-35)

- Jesus' answers were anchored in scripture
- Jesus taught as one <u>having authority</u>
- Jesus leaves His opponents <u>speechless</u>

A Question About Taxation

- Not an either/or but a both/and
- Being made in the likeness of God points us to a higher purpose and calling

A Question About Resurrection

- Do we know the scriptures and the power of God?
- We all live forever. It's the destination that counts

A Question about the Commandments

- Love God and neighbor. Do this and you will live.
- <u>Jesus alone</u> has kept these commandments

A Counterchallenge From Jesus

(Mark 12:35-37)

 Jesus the Messiah is both <u>fully man and fully God</u>, possessing all authority (see also Matt 28:18)

For Life Group Discussion

Mark 12:13-37

- 1. How have you been positively impacted by a teacher? Were you surprised to learn that this was the label most frequently applied to Jesus?
- 2. it was noted that Jesus based His answers in the scriptures (see also Matthew 4:1-11). Do you feel equipped to answer objections in the same way? Why or why not?
- 3. Read Mark 12:17. At what point does our loyalty to God outweigh our support of government? How does Exodus 1:15-17, Daniel 3:14-18, and Acts 4:18-20 & 5:28-29 inform our response?
- 4. The Sadducees were criticized by Jesus for a lack of knowledge and trust (read Mark 12:24)
 - How are you intentionally strengthening your knowledge of the Bible? What could you do to accelerate your learning?
 - In what ways do you underestimate the power of God? In what areas would you say, "Lord I believe, help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24)?
- 5. How can we grow in our capacity to love God simply for who He is, and not just because of what He has done for us?
- 6. Why would Jesus conclude this discussion on authority with His question in Mark 12:37? How do verses like Mat 11:27, 28:19 & Luke 1:32-33 (and others) help us understand His point?
