- In your R elational life.
 - Rock (Matt. 5:44) vs. Sand (Matt. 5:46)
 - Jesus' <u>actions</u> revealed in Matthew 9:35-36.
- In your Public life.
 - Rock (Matt. 5:19) vs. Sand (Matt. 7:28-29)
 - Jesus' witness revealed in Matthew 27:50-54.

Questions for personal reflection and Life Group discussion...

 - How does your coming under the weight of the Father (thinking of God's holiness, truth, and love) move you to take a particular platform that is wholly consistent with the teachings of Christ, his apostles, and his church?
 - Where do you see both individuals and cultures imploding under their denial of Christ's finished work?
