- Word-centered and Word-saturated
- Doxological: All to the praise of God
- Dialogical: A conversation between God and us
- Simple: Focused on what we're hearing
- Reverent and joy-filled as recipients of grace
- Edifying: Encouraging and equipping
- Verbal: Listening and speaking

The Spirit of God has chosen to work by the Word of God

Disciples were sent out by Jesus with the Spirit and the Word (Eph 2:19-20)

Ministry is simple

• Love the Lord, love His people, love the Word (Jn 21:15-17)

Paul instructed Timothy to devote himself "to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation, to teaching" (1 Tim 4:13)

- Teaching: The explanation that follows the reading (Neh 8:8; Lk 4:16-21; Acts 13:13-16; Acts 8:30-31)
- Exhortation: Minds informed and <u>hearts aflame</u>. Well instructed and <u>well nourished</u>.

"Preaching should afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted"

"A sermon begins at the application." - Spurgeon

Three things to remember:

- 1. Listen <u>astutely</u>. Demand the Word from your Pastor
- 2. Listen attentively. You're accountable for what you hear
- 3. Be <u>responsive</u>. Rely on the Spirit to work through the Word
