Why Study Hebrews?

- It's a rich treasure, connecting the Old Testament to the New
- The challenges described and the solution prescribed <u>apply to</u> all believers

The Dangerous Temptation

- We can <u>slip back</u> instead of <u>pressing forward</u>
- We can retreat from the substance and return to the shadows

The Final Word and Final Way

- Jesus doesn't just tell us the message, <u>He is the message</u>
- Jesus is the only true and living way that <u>leads to eternal life with</u> the <u>Father</u>

The Compelling Call

- Strong and terrifying <u>warnings</u>
- Followed by a solid <u>prescription</u>:
 - Gain a fresh understanding of the <u>supremacy of Christ</u> and the <u>truth of the Gospel</u>

- 1. What was your reaction when you learned that we would be studying the Letter to the Hebrews? Excitement? Intimidation? Curiosity? How familiar are you with this letter?
- 2. At what point in your Christian life did your zeal burn the brightest? What has caused it to cool off since then? What would it take to rekindle that fire?
- 3. How has your faith been impacted by hardship? What kind of questions do you ask during times of struggle? What has been most helpful, or most encouraging and life-giving?
- 4. Read Heb 1:1-3a and Col 1:15-17. How would you describe Jesus to someone using these verses as a reference?
- 5. Read Heb 10:19-21. How are these statements of fact related to the commands that follow in verses 22, 23, and 24-25? Do you understand the relationship indicative/exposition and imperative/encouragement? Can you find other examples?
- 5. Read all of Hebrews chapter 11. With that context, what is the impact of 12:1-3? What situation are you facing right now that calls for an exercise of bold faith?
