

All the passages in the Bible speaking about same sex issues point to ____ as being the sin.

To the degree that same sex attraction is the result of our fallen nature, of our DNA, the person experiencing that attraction has done nothing ____ feeling that way.

Since same sex attraction is the result of the Fall, of sin, it's also not how God originally intended to ____ that person.

Does the fact that such attractions occur in nature mean that they are from God? Has God made them this way? Again, that is certainly a conclusion that some people say that they have come to, but other sexual minorities reject this reasoning. Instead, they argue that their attractions are the result of the fall, that they would not have had attractions to the same sex apart from a fallen world much like the person suffering from depression would not contend with lower levels of the neurotransmitters serotonin or dopamine that would contribute to bouts of depression. These low levels are not due to the personal sin of the individual who deals with depression. However, they exist and would not have existed apart from a world in which the fall affects every aspect of creation, including neurotransmitters. People who suffer from depression have choices to make about how they cope with and deal with their tendency toward depression, and the church can become a community that aids them in their struggle in this area.
