Two levels of surrender in our "closets":

- 1. Surrender the ____ of the closet.
- 2. Surrender the ____ of cleaning it out to Jesus.

In a practical sense, it means I have to ____ what's in my "closet" and that it's beyond *me* to clean out on my own.

People who conceal their sins will not prosper, but if they confess and turn from them, they will receive mercy.

As we confess, it's not a guarantee everything's going to now go perfectly, but we are promised "____" and even "times of refreshment."

Apostle Peter: Now repent of your sins and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped away. Then times of refreshment will come from the presence of the Lord.... —Acts 3:19-20 (NLT)

What Jesus tells us is to focus on him and follow him, and God will ____ our steps.

Jesus: ... If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.
