July 1, 2018 BUILDING SUCCESSFUL RELATIONSHIPS - Part 6 "Communication"

Communication is so important for building healthy <u>relationships</u>.

Genesis 1:3-4 (NIV): "³And God *said*, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. ⁴God saw that the light was good...." (*emphasis added*)

Proverbs 15:1 (NIV): "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."

Proverbs 16:24 (NLT): "Kind words are like honey – sweet to the soul and healthy for the body."

Proverbs 18:20 (NLT): "Wise words satisfy like a good meal; the right words bring satisfaction."

Jesus: "'A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart. What you say flows from what is in your heart.'" (**Luke 6:45** NLT)

James 1:26 (NIV): "If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight rein on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless."

Every relationship is totally dependent on communication to <u>survive</u>.

The <u>quality</u> of the communication in our relationships is just as important to health as the actual presence of communication.

Ephesians 4:29 (NASB): "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such *a word* as is good for edification according to the need *of the moment,* so that it will give grace to those who hear."

"unwholesome word" (Greek) = *putrid* or *rotten*

Proverbs 18:21 (NKJV): "Death and life are in the power of the tongue..."

We can just as easily <u>build up</u> as tear down, and the results for everyone are better and so much more rewarding!

Just as important to communication is listening.

Proverbs 18:2 (ESV): "A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion."

James 1:19 (NLT): "Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters: You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry."

Communication is not limited to our words but also includes the <u>tone</u> of our voice and our <u>nonverbal</u> behaviors, such as expressions, posture, etc.

Men and women tend to communicate <u>differently</u>.

For the disciple of Jesus, the focus has to be on the other person.

Philippians 2:3-5 (NIV): "³Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. ⁴Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. ⁵Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus"

Colossians 3:17 (NLT): "And whatever you do or say, do it as a representative of the Lord Jesus..."
