#### Recap

#### How are we bound to Christ?

- "<sup>16</sup> For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup> And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together." (Col 1:16–17)
- 1 Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. <sup>3</sup> He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. (Heb 1:1–3)

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#### The effects of sin

- Sin is the imposition of a new sustainer
- Athanasius
  - The trajectory of creation is reversed in sin
- Augustine
  - Greater vs. Diminished existence
- Salvation must reestablish Christ as the Source of Life

# Our life is "in Christ"

- <sup>20</sup> I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. (Ga 2:20)
- <sup>3</sup> For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. (Col 3:3–4)

## Christ's fate becomes our fate

#### • Ephesians

- blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing (1:3)
- he chose us in him (v. 4)
- he has blessed us in the Beloved (v. 6)
- In him we have redemption (v. 7)
- to unite all things *in him* (v. 10)
- In him we have obtained an inheritance (v. 11)
- In him you also...were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit (v. 13)
- the working of his great might <sup>20</sup> that he worked *in Christ* (vv. 1:19–20)
- made us alive together with Christ...and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places *in Christ Jesus* (2:5-6)
- created in Christ Jesus for good works (v. 10)

# One flesh with Christ

<sup>28</sup> In the same way husbands should love their wives *as their own bodies*. He who loves his wife *loves himself*. <sup>29</sup> For no one ever hated *his own flesh*, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, <sup>30</sup> because *we are members of his body*. <sup>31</sup> "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and *the two shall become one flesh*." <sup>32</sup> This mystery is profound, and *I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church*. (Eph 5:28–32)
