Exploring the Word – Romans 8:26-28

- 1. As you listened to the message, what points stood out?
- 2. Read Romans 8:26-27. In these verses, what three ways does the apostle Paul state that the Holy Spirit helps us when we pray? How else does the Spirit inspire us to pray (refer to Romans 8:15)?
- 3. How does Jesus intercede for us when we pray (refer to Hebrews 7:24-25 & 1 John 2:1)? How does the knowledge of how Jesus and the Holy Spirit intercede for each believer in prayer affect your view of prayer?
- 4. Read Mark 1:7-8, Luke 24:29, & Acts 19:1-2, 6. Discuss how these passages of Scripture show that speaking in tongues is a normative experience available for every believer. How does this knowledge impact your view of speaking in tongues?
- 5. Why is praying and worshiping in tongues a mindful experience? How does a person seek the Baptism in the Holy Spirit?
- 6. Read Romans 8:28. Even though God is working in our lives for good, things don't always go as we expect or desire. How can we account for this? How does prayer help us trust God and prepare us to embrace whatever happens in our lives?
