- 1. As you listened to the message, what points stood out?
- 2. Read Genesis 2:18-25 & Ephesians 5:31-33. Why is marriage so important to God? For what purposes did he design it?
- 3. Read Malachi 2:14-15. How do these verses reiterate the importance of the marriage covenant? How does unfaithfulness violate this?
- 4. Why is the Trinity of God the ultimate example of mutual submission and oneness in marriage? In what ways can we emulate the love between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in the marriage relationship?
- 5. Read Malachi 2:16-17. Why does God "hate" divorce? Is divorce, then, an unforgivable sin? Does the culture we live in seem to value the covenant of marriage?
- 6. Read Malachi 3:1-4. How does God promise to respond to the people's negative words in Malachi 2:17? Who is the messenger that Malachi is referring to? How will this help refine them (refer to Romans 3:25-26)?
