- 3. What are some strategies we can employ to combat sinful thoughts? Conversely, give examples of things we can do every day to help us focus on the Holy Spirit's influence in our lives.
- 4. Read John 14:27 and Philippians 4:7. What does peace truly look like in the life of a believer?
- 5. Read Romans 8:7-10. What are some examples of things we choose to do that please God? In what ways do our decisions influence our ability to please God?
- 6. According to the apostle Paul, what is necessary to be "controlled by the Spirit?" Why can't a person be justified if they refuse to participate in the process of sanctification? What role does the Holy Spirit play in justification and sanctification?
