Exploring the Word - Malachi 3:1-9

- 1. As you listened to the message, what points stood out?
- 2. Read Malachi 3:1-4. Even though the people have "wearied the Lord," God still promises to send them messengers. What does this tell us about God's nature? How can we do a better job of reflecting His nature in our relationships?
- 3. Who are the messengers that Malachi is referring to? How will this help refine the people (refer to Romans 3:25-26)?
- 4. Read Malachi 3:5-6. Who does God promise to judge in these verses? Do we still see these same behaviors in our culture? How can we ensure we don't sin against God in these same ways?
- 5. Read Malachi 3:7-9. God calls the people to repent and return to him. How have they "cheated" him? Why does Malachi use such a strong word to describe their actions?
- 6. Read Psalm 50:10-12. Even though God already owns everything, why is the tithe so important to Him? How much are we commanded to tithe (refer to Leviticus 27:30; Numbers 18:26; & Deuteronomy 14:22)? How is the tithe different from an offering?
