True Generosity starts by giving yourself to God

- Affliction + Joy + Poverty = Generosity?
- Seek God's Kingdom first
- Proper response to the Gospel





True Generosity is modeled in the Gospel

- God's Love expressed through Grace
- Father, Son, and Spirit demonstrate generosity
- Savior was homeless





True Generosity requires consistency and discipline

- Corinth had the desire, but struggled with follow through
- First Fruits





True Generosity is proportional to income

- By your ability
- Tithing isn't specifically referenced





True Generosity is well informed and biblically directed

- Will it supply someone's need
- Should be carefully directed

- Look for opportunities to give
