Romans (The Gospel According to Paul)

- Mankind has an inescapable sin problem which traces all the way back to Adam
 *All are guilty, it is obvious, we are without excuse.
- The wages of this sin problem is death/separation from God.
 *There is nothing we can do on our own to fix this.
- God has provided a rescue/a justification
 *Faith in the substitutionary death of Christ on our behalf.





Rom. 6:1-14

 Context the more..."

 Potential Objection which makes God look amazing??"

As in Ch. 3, Paul responds: God forbid!!!



Rom. 5:20-21 "...where sin increased, grace abounded all

* "so, we should sin more then, since sin leads to grace



Rom. 6:1-7

- Illustration from Baptism
 - 1. Immersion, Conscious choice
 - 2. Visible symbol of invisible event a. Under water: death, tomb, darkness b. Raised up: resurrection, new life, c. United with Christ! I. His death (a funeral of sorts?) II. New life (resurrection!)





Rom. 6:1-7

Phrase, "dead to sin"..?

1. Don't sin anymore? Don't struggle with temptation? Impossible for a Believer to sin or struggle?

2. No. A Death to the GUILT of sina. Sin has not more claim or demandb. Able to claim the justification God offers

Pre-conversion life, death, baptism, Post-conversion life.





Rom. 6:8-11

• "The life He lives, He lives to God" Rom. 6:10

1. This is the "middle ground" between Justification and **Glorification ... SANCTIFICATION!**

2. NOT "our efforts to be good so God will love us" NO! Rather, our response to our good and loving God who has Justified, Redeemed and Saved us!





Rom. 6:12-14

- Clearly, we will battle sinful desires!
 - 1. If it were not so, Paul wouldn't urge us to "not let sin reign"
 - 2. If it were not so, Paul wouldn't urge us to "not present the members of our body as instruments of unrighteousness"
- But the battle is BECAUSE of God's love for us, NOT to earn it.
 - 1. God's end goal is to FREE us from the mastery of sin *which pollutes natural desires to glorify self

*How would I explain the difference between "struggling with sin" while yet "being dead to sin"?

*In what ways am I "presenting the members of my body as instruments of unrighteousness"? What is God calling me to do about that?

*Why is Christ-centered discipleship and living NOT "works righteousness" or "anti-nomianism"?
