STUDY GUIDE INSTRUCTIONS

Instructions for "Discuss: Instruction/Application" questions in the study guide.

- First, look up the 'Instruction' passage in the Law and briefly summarize it in one or two sentences. (The instruction passage is the part of the law that instructs Israel on how they were to act, believe, or live. Do not use commentaries. Instead, simply look up the verse and summarize its instruction to Israel.)
- 2 Next, look up the 'Application' passage (THE APPLICATION PASSAGE IS NOT YOUR APPLICATION. IT IS THE PASSAGE IN WHICH THE LAW MUST BE APPLIED OR UNDERSTOOD IN ORDER TO CORRECTLY BE INTERPRETED) and briefly summarize it in one or two sentences.
 - Finally, explain why/how the instruction passage relates to / impacts the interpretation of the 'application' passage. For example, "The Law instructs Israel not to do X. Israel is doing X. That is bad."



Deuteronomy 28:13, 44 in Gospels/Acts (i.e., Luke 3:1)

Instruction (Deut 28:13, 44) – Curses for Disobedience

Application (Gospel/Acts, i.e., Luke 3:1) – Israel's Situation with Respect to Her Enemies



Deuteronomy 28:15-68 in Revelation 6:3-8

Instruction (Deut 28:15-68) - Curses

Application (Rev 6:3-8) – Horsemen #2, 3, 4



Deuteronomy 28:51-52 in Judges 6:1-5, 13

Instruction (Deut 28:51-52) – Curses for Disobedience

Application (Jdg 6:1-5, 13) – Israel's Enemies and Gideon's Reasoning



Deuteronomy 29:4 in Isaiah 6; Isaiah 29:10; Romans 11:8

Instruction (Deut 29:4) - Heart to Know, Eyes to See, Ears to Hear

Application (Isaiah 6:9-10) – Judgment Upon Israel

Application (Romans 11:8) – Israel's Continued Judgment



Deuteronomy 30:1-6 in Luke 15:11-24

Instruction (Deut 30:1-6) – God's Heart Toward the Repentant Nation

Application (Luke 15:11-24) – The Lost Son



Deuteronomy 30:1-6 in Acts 3 and 11

Instruction (Deut 30:1-6) – Repentance that Returns One to God

Application (Acts 3 and 11) - Repentance of Israel, Repentance of Gentiles

1. Deuteronomy 28 is one of the most important chapters in the whole Bible for understanding the story of the Bible. There is literally no book in the Bible after Deuteronomy that chapter 28 does not play a direct role. That includes both Old Testament and New Testament.

Read chapter 28 and make a list of passages that come to mind while reading this most important chapter.



2. In light of the homework question on Deuteronomy 29:4, think through what Jesus says to his disciples after He begins to teach Israel in parables. This is found in Matthew 13:1-23 (The Parable of the Sower).

What do the disciples have that Israel does not?

What will they have more of?

How does this passage relate to Deuteronomy 29:4, Isaiah 6, Isaiah 29:10, and Romans 11:8?



3. Read Luke 15.

List all of the similarities between the younger brother and the judgment and return of Israel in Deuteronomy 28 and Deuteronomy 30.
