Discussion Questions

- 6. What are we looking for in the Old Testament story? How does understanding we're tracking "the seed" and looking for the True Image Bearer help you read these books differently?
- 7. **Review the covenant warnings and promises** (Deuteronomy 28-30). Why did God give Israel such specific warnings about what would happen if they disobeyed?
- 8. The study mentioned God's character is revealed in how He responds to adversity. What does Israel's repeated failure and God's repeated mercy teach us about who God is?
- 9. **Discuss the pattern we see repeated in Judges:** Israel sins → God disciplines → Israel cries out → God raises up a deliverer → temporary peace → Israel sins again. Why do you think this cycle kept repeating?
- 10. The study highlighted how Israel was warned not to make covenants with the inhabitants of the land (starting with Rahab). Why was this command so

important? What was God protecting them from? How does this relate to 2 Corinthians 6:14?

11. Look at the requirements for Israel's king (Deuteronomy 17:14-20):

Don't multiply horses (military might)

Don't multiply wives (divided heart)

Don't multiply gold/silver (wealth)

Must write a copy of the Law and read it daily

How did Solomon violate every single one? What was the result? What does this teach us about God's commands?

12. The scarlet thread appears with Zerah, then with Rahab, and disappears from Zerah's line (Achan). What is the significance of this detail? How does it show God's sovereignty in preserving the line of the Messiah?
