

Small Group Guide: The Word Became Flesh

Based on John 1:1-18

Opening Prayer

Begin your group time by thanking God for His Word and asking the Holy Spirit to help your understanding as you discuss how Jesus is the fulfillment of everything God has been revealing since the beginning.

Icebreaker Question

What is one thing you've been eagerly waiting for or anticipating? How did it feel when it finally arrived?

Sermon Recap

This sermon traced how the Word of God that spoke to Moses, was confirmed through the prophets, and ultimately became flesh in Jesus Christ. The same Word that created everything, promised eternal life, and revealed God's character to Moses now walked among us in human form — allowing humanity to see God's glory and live.

Key Takeaways

1. **The Word is not new** - Jesus is the same Word that has existed from the beginning, spoken to Moses, and was confirmed by the prophets.
2. **The Word became flesh** - Jesus is the Word that stepped off the pages of the Old Testament and took on human form.
3. **Israel missed Him** - God's own people didn't recognize Him when He came because the truth had been maligned by false teaching.
4. **The choice remains** - We must choose to receive Him (life) or reject Him (death).

Discussion Questions

Understanding the Text

1. **Read John 1:1-5.** How does John connect Jesus to the creation account in Genesis? Why is this connection important?
2. **What does it mean that "the Word became flesh and dwelt (tabernacled) among us"?** How does this relate to the tabernacle in the wilderness with Moses?
3. **Why couldn't Moses see God's face and live (Exodus 33:20), but the disciples could see Jesus and live?** What changed?

Going Deeper

4. **The sermon emphasized that Israel had the Word but didn't recognize Jesus when He came.** What are some ways that false teaching can twist Scripture so that people miss who Jesus really is?
5. **How can we, as people who have God's Word, avoid making the same mistake Israel made?** What safeguards can we put in place?
6. **The sermon described God as "abounding in loyal love and truth"—a covenant-keeping God who gives at His expense for the benefit of others.** How have you experienced this character of God in your own life?

Accountability Questions

1. Are you regularly reading God's Word so you can recognize truth from error?
2. Is there anyone in your life you've been avoiding sharing the gospel with? Why?
3. How are you practically receiving Jesus daily—not just as a past decision, but as an ongoing relationship?

Prayer Focus

Pray for:

- Eyes to see Jesus clearly in Scripture
- Protection from false teaching that maligns the truth
- Boldness to share the light of Christ with others
- Specific people in your lives who need to receive Jesus
- A deeper understanding of what it means that "the Word became flesh"

Closing Thought

"The word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." - John 1:14
