1 Timothy 6

REVIEW

In order to address the problem of false teachers of the law, Paul leaves Timothy in Ephesus.

Timothy is to do the following:

- 1) confront those who are incorrectly teaching the law of Moses (chapter 1),
- 2) encourage men and women to conduct themselves properly,
- 3) appoint overseers and deacons to assist in the leading of the church, and 4) conduct himself in a manner that is fitting (chapters 4-6).



1 Timothy 6

MONDAY

Listen to the 1 Timothy 6 podcast.

TUESDAY

Similar to Paul's instruction to Titus in chapter 2, 1 Timothy 6 instructs the believing one not only in how to act but why.

Two words that are important to point out are the Greek words "*hina*" (most often translated "*in order that*") and "*hoti*" (most often translated "*that*" or "*because*"). "*Hina*" occurs in 1 Timothy 6:1 and 19. "*Hoti*" occurs twice in 1 Timothy 6:2 and then again in 6:7. Pay attention to these "*causal*" phrases when reading the Bible.

WEDNESDAY

Read 1 Timothy 6:3-11 again. As we have explained previously, the "*teaching*" of the apostles is central to godliness in the life of the believer.

What happens if this teaching is not followed?

Do you see any of these things in your life?

THURSDAY

Read 1 Timothy 6:12-16 again.

What is your motivation for following the teaching in the Bible?

Read these verses carefully. Remember, this is Paul's most important charge to Timothy in this letter.

What does he include and why?

FRIDAY

Read 1 Timothy 6 again and pay special attention to verses 18-19.

What does Paul command to be “rich” in?

How can you apply Paul’s teaching to Timothy in this chapter?
