- 2. Read Rev. 3:15-16. What does it look like to be a lukewarm church? What does/has lukewarm spirituality looked like in your Christian walk?
- 3. Read Rev. 3:17-18. Take a moment to recount the three things that Laodicea was famous for during the writing of this letter (banking, black wool, eye salve). How does this factor into what Jesus says to them in verses 17-18? Do we (or our churches) think that we are self-reliant and have no need of Jesus? How does this happen and what does it look like?
- 4. What are you tempted to depend on more than God? (Business / Education / money / retirement / relationship with significant other / government / etc.)
- 5. Dan said, "Material abundance can lead to spiritual poverty." Why do you think this happens? What are ways that a church/people can stay spiritually dependent on God?
- 6. Pastor Dan said that Jesus' invitation to Laodicea was an Invitation to dependence. Where in your life is Jesus inviting you to move from independence to dependence on Him today? As PGC enters into a season of pastoral transition, how can we pursue active dependence on God together in this time?
