Investigating Christianity 02: "Monotheism" Genesis 12

Main idea: There are three major mono-theistic religions in the world; it is important to examine the religious leaders of each as they define and interpret religious doctrine.

Big Minds on God

You might be surprised to find out that many of the brightest scientific minds of the 20th and 21st centuries agree: There is more evidence supporting the existence of God than against the existence of God.

- □ "I am a scientist and a believer, and I find <u>no conflict</u> between those world views...and neither apparently do the 40 percent of working scientists who claim to be believers [in a personal God]. Francis Collins

1 Man - Abram

It all began with a man named "Abram" (God later changed his name to "Abraham" – Genesis 17:5). The three major monotheistic religions all started with one man – Abraham. Judaism and Islam both claim Abraham as their "founding father". Christianity, because it finds its roots in Judaism, looks to Abraham as well (Romans 4:1-5; 16-17).

□ **This is BIG!** Abraham's Genesis 12 encounter with God produced the 3 major monotheistic religions – Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

Definition: "Mono-theism" = One God

The word monotheism comes from the Greek "monos," which means "one", and "theos," which means "god". Thus, monotheism is a belief in the existence of a single god. Monotheism is usually contrasted with polytheism, which is the belief in many gods, and atheism, which is the absence of any belief in gods.

Close

Consider your faith. If you have reasonable doubts about Christ and Christianity, do your homework. Or at least use a communication card so you and I can have a conversation. Above all, please don't continue to believe that all religions are the same and have been somehow, disproven by science. Nothing could be farther from the truth.

Family Night Big idea - Read Genesis 12:1-8

Abraham is the father of Judaism and in a related way, Christianity. Make sure you children understand that Christianity grows out of Judaism. The two monotheistic faiths are closely related.

- **Elementary School** Ask, "What did God promise to do for Abram? When God told Abram to go to a new land, what did Abram do? What did God promise to Abram's descendants?"
- **Middle/ High School** Ask, "How are Christianity and Judaism closely related? Why do people sometimes say that all religions are the same? How would "all people on the earth" be blessed by Abraham?"
