Verse: Matthew 13:1-23

PRAY

Begin your group study with an opening prayer. Acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit, who serves as a teacher as you gather.

REVIEW

What truth did you discover in the previous lesson? Did it transform how you live your life in any way? Even if it was small.

CONNECT

In this lesson, we are looking at what it means to be generous with sharing our faith with others. As a group, share your thoughts on the following questions.

Have you ever been the bearer of really good news to someone, so good that it changed their life in some way? What was that news? How did it impact that person? What did it feel like to share the news? How did you feel when you saw their reaction to the news?

OBSERVE

Read your selected passage out loud as a group. While you read, take note of details, words, or phrases that jump off the page. Take a moment to share your findings with the group.

DISCUSS

On a scale from 1-10 (1 = no belief and 10 = completely believe), how much would you say you believe in the power of the gospel to change people's lives? Have you experienced this personally? Have you seen the gospel change someone you know or love? How did that process work?

What does evangelism mean to you? What does that look like in your life presently? How often would you honestly say you share the message of the gospel with others?

What kind of obstacles do you experience when it comes to sharing your faith with others? Do you ever feel inadequate? Is there anyone in your life that you admire for sharing their faith? What is it about them that you admire?

What does it look like to be equipped to share your faith? Are there areas that you feel like you don't understand about the gospel? How would you encourage others to move towards sharing the gospel? What would it look like to encourage yourself in this area?

MAIN IDEA

In one to three sentences, summarize your main take-away from this lesson. Share your thoughts with the group.
