Verse: Luke 6:46-49

PRAY

Begin your group study with an opening prayer. Acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit, who serves as a teacher as you gather.

REVIEW

What truth did you discover in the previous lesson? Did it transform how you live your life in any way? Even if it was small.

CONNECT

In this lesson, we are looking at what it means to follow Jesus and put his words into practice. As a group, share your thoughts on the following questions.

Have you ever practiced for something, like a test or a sport, but never actually got a chance to play? What was it? How did it make you feel to put in all the time and energy to practice for no reason? How did you deal with the situation? Would you have done something different looking back?

OBSERVE

Read your selected passage out loud as a group. While you read, take note of details, words, or phrases that jump off the page. Take a moment to share your findings with the group.

DISCUSS

As you read this week's verses, was there anything that stood out to you? Maybe something that you didn't notice before? What was it? Why did it stand out?

How do you think the people listening felt about Jesus' words when he said, "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say?" What do you think Jesus' point was in making this statement?

In this parable, a wise man and a foolish man are contrasted. Who do you think the wise man represents amongst the people listening to Jesus? How about the foolish man?

A unique aspect of a parable is that they have a twist, what is the twist in this parable? How would you describe it in your own words?

What does this parable tell us about how we should live our lives? Is there a lesson to be learned or applied?

MAIN IDEA

In one to three sentences, summarize your main take-away from this lesson. Share your thoughts with the group.

PRAY
