#### What does God call Himself? NAMES OF GOD

#### **Primary Names:**

- **1. Elohim**: "Strong One" (2601 times in the OT)
- 2. JEHOVAH: never occurs in the OT. YHWH in Exodus 3:14: 6:6 (6828 times in the OT) Artificial English word from YHWH + vowels of ADONA = YaHoWaH YHWH translated as "LORD"
- 3. Adonai: means "Lord" or "master." Used 773 times in the OT, over 300 times of God.

## **Compound Old Testament Names (13 names)**

- 1. El Elyon God Most High (Genesis 14:22)
- 2. El Olam the Everlasting God (Genesis 21:33; Isaiah 40:28)
- 3. El Shaddai the Almighty God (Genesis 17:1)
- 4. Yahweh Jireh The LORD provides (Genesis 22:14). This is the only occurrence.
- 5. Yahweh Nissi The LORD is my Banner (Exodus 17:15) God is victorious over His enemies.
- 6. Yahweh Shalom The LORD is peace (Judges 6:24).
- 7. Yahweh Sabbaoth The LORD of hosts (1 Samuel 1:3).
- 8. Yahweh Maccaddeschem The LORD your sanctifier (Exodus 31:13).
- 9. Yahweh Roi The LORD my shepherd (Psalm 23:1; 80:1-2).
- 10. Yahweh Tsidkenu The LORD our Righteousness (Jeremiah 23:6).
- 11. Yahweh Shammah The LORD is there (Ezekiel 48:35).
- 12. Yahweh Elohim Israel "The LORD God of Israel" used 99x in OT (Judges 5:3)
- 13. Qadosh Israel "The Holy One of Israel" title used (30x in OT) (25x in Isaiah)
- What is the Trinity? The Trinity is the one true God exists as three eternal and co-equal persons,

Who are distinct, but not separate. The word TRINITY is NOT used in the Bible!

1. Evidence for oneness: Old Testament- Deuteronomy 6:4; 4:35; 32:39; Isaiah 45:14; 46:9.

New Testament: 1 Corinthians 8:4; James 2:19

# 2. Evidence for Threeness in New Testament

- a. The Father is recognized as God. John 6:27
- b. Jesus Christ is recognized as God. John 20:28 and Jesus claimed to be God. John 10:30 "I and the Father are one."
- c. The Holy Spirit is recognized as God. Acts 5:3-4; John 3:5, 6, 8

# 3. Evidence for Threeness in Old Testament

- a. Passages which use plural word for God (Elohim) and plural pronouns. Genesis 1:1-2, 26
- b. The Angel of Yahweh is recognized as God and yet is distinct from God. Genesis 22:15-16

- c. Messiah is called the Mighty God (Isaiah 9:6) and is ascribed eternality (Micah 5:2), One born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14) and names 'Immanuel" which means "God with us." Psalm 110:1
- d. Three persons seen in Old Testament Passages of Isaiah 48:16; Isaiah 61:1-2

# The Father

## 1. The particular relationships of the Father

- a. All people are called the offspring of God. Acts 17:29
- b. God is the Father of the nation Israel. Exodus 4:22
- c. God is the Father of the Lord Jesus Christ. Matthew 3:17
- d. In a very special way, God is the Father of all who believe in Christ. Galatians 3:26

# 2. The particular works of the Father

- a. It is the Father who was the Author of the decree or plan of God. Psalm 2:7-9
- b. The Father was the Author of the act of election. Ephesians 1:3-6
- c. The Father sent the Son into this world. John 5:37
- d. The Father is the disciplinarian of His children. Hebrews 12:9
- e. Important ramifications of the doctrine of God
  - gods of our own making are false. We know God not because we can produce it ourselves, but because God has revealed Himself to us. Beware of creating a god!
  - 2. If we accept the facts about the true God which have been revealed, then it shouldn't be difficult to believe He could and can do what is claimed of Him-creation, miracles, inspired Bible, Incarnation, prophecy, etc.!
