

1, 2, & 3 JOHN CONTRASTING WHAT'S TRUE AND NOT TRUE ABOUT JESUS

PART 1: CONTRAST

To help pass the baton of faith from one generation of Jesus followers to the next, John lays out some characteristics of those who truly follow Jesus—and those who only claim to.

John, one of the original twelve disciples, wrote the letters of 1, 2, and 3 John at a time when almost all eyewitnesses of Jesus's life on earth had died. People with no firsthand experience with Jesus were spreading false information, and John wanted to clarify who Jesus was while he still had time.

SCRIPTURE

1 JOHN 1:5-10

This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

DISCUSSION [1].

REFLECT: Think about an organization that has transitioned due to a complete turnover of leadership and people, or perhaps when you've lost a patriarch or matriarch of your family.

QUESTION (A): What changes happen when the main person (or people) is no longer there?

DISCUSSION [2].

REFLECT: Almost all John's closest friends died untimely due to their association with Jesus.

QUESTION (A): Have you ever been inspired to do something (or preserve something) due to losing someone you cared about?

QUESTION (B): How would that impact his motivation to pass on what's true about Jesus?

DISCUSSION [3].

QUESTION (A): Did the video change or inform how you view John's three short letters?

DISCUSSION [4].

REFLECT:: Read 1 JOHN 1:5-10

QUESTION (B): When are you most vulnerable to slipping toward darkness?
