





July 20, 1775:

Three millions of people on their knees at once, supplicating the aid of Heaven, is a striking circumstance, and a very singular one in America. May the blessings of Heaven follow in answer to our prayers...


Feb 28, 1795 Samuel Adams:

Signer of the Declaration issued a statewide Fasting, Humiliation and Prayer Proclamation, while Governor of Massachusetts.




Mar 23, 1798

Issued a national fasting and prayer proclamation




Feb 20, 1807 Jonathan Trumbull
