 - | an *authoritative* decision
 - | an *authoritative* manner
- 2** : possessing recognized or evident authority : clearly accurate or knowledgeable
 - | an *authoritative* critique
 - | an *authoritative* source of information

in·fal·li·ble (,)in-'fa-lə-bəl ◀▶▶

Synonyms of *infallible* >

1 : incapable of error : **UNERRING**

| an *infallible* memory

2 : not liable to mislead, deceive, or disappoint : **CERTAIN**

| an *infallible* remedy

3 : incapable of error in defining doctrines touching faith or morals

: free from error





Bible claims perfection:

- *The words of the Lord are pure words, like silver refined in a furnace on the ground, purified seven times. Psalm 12:6*
- *The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple; Psalm 19:7*
- *Every word of God is pure: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him. Proverbs 30:5*

Bible taken as whole and of/from God:

- *All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 2 Tim 3:16*

Reasons for Inerrancy...



Bible judges us, not us judging it:

- *For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. Hebrews 4:12*
- *But who are you, O man, to answer back to God? Will what is molded say to its molder, "Why have you made me like this?" Romans 9:20*

Bible requires our study:

- *The brothers immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when they arrived they went into the Jewish synagogue. Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so. Acts 17:10-11*
