5-chapter letter near the end of the N.T.


• Written from Rome (called "Babylon") to Christians in Asian Minor (Turkey)

Attributed to **Peter the Apostle**

- Missionary ("fisher of men")
- Shepherd ("feed my sheep")

Martin Luther: 1 Peter contains *everything* a Christian needs to know.





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
MAJOR THEMES

- 1. Responding to **Suffering:** How do we make sense of the pain and persecution?
- 2. **Hope** for the future: Jesus' resurrection and exaltation gives us hope.
- 3. Christian **Identity:** Citizens of Heaven, rooted in Jesus.
- 4. Christians and **Culture:** Living responsibly as dual citizens of Heaven and earth.
- **5. Holiness:** Living with Christian morals even when it becomes costly.





"Peter's readers were experiencing various kinds of trials that were causing them varying degrees of grief and suffering. Their Christian faith was being slandered and maligned. Their social status, family relationships, and possibly even their livelihood were threatened. WHEN WAS 1 PETER WRITTEN?

56-58 A.D.

Paul writes the book of Romans, but doesn't mention Peter (who wrote 1 Peter from Rome) 68 A.D.

Nero is killed. The upper limit on 1 Peter since Peter was killed during Nero's reign.



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56-58 A.D.

Paul writes the book of Romans, but doesn't mention Peter (who wrote 1 Peter from Rome) 64-68 A.D.

68 A.D.

Widespread
persecution of the
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Roman Emperor
Nero. 1 Peter 2:13-17
makes this unlikely.

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"Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor." 1 Peter 2:17 (NIV)

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

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
EVIDENCE FOR PETER

- Direct attribution: 1 Peter 1:1
- Early church tradition: Papias (60-130 AD) references "The Epistle of Peter"
- Extensive knowledge of the teachings of Jesus. Up to <u>30</u> references (Selwyn, 1958)
- Earlier theology about the return of Jesus
- The help of Silas/Silvanus (5:12)




PETER'S DEATH

- Peter died by **crucifixion** during the reign of Nero (Eusebius, Church History 2.25.5 & Tertullian, Scorpiace 15)
- Nero (who died in 68 AD), was angry that Peter had been killed without his knowledge—because he wanted the chance to torture him more. (Eusebius, *Acts of Peter,* 41)











1 PETER 1:1-2

Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ,

To God's **elect**, exiles scattered throughout the provinces of Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia and Bithynia, 2 who have been **chosen** according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to be obedient to Jesus Christ and sprinkled with his blood:

Grace and peace be yours in abundance.

1 PETER 1:3-5 (NIV)

"3 **Praise** be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, 5 who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time"



1 PETER 1:6-9 (NIV)

"6 In all this you greatly **rejoice**, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. 7 These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in **praise**, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. 8 Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious **joy**, 9 for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls."





1 PETER 1:10-12 (NIV)

"10 Concerning this salvation, the prophets, who spoke of the grace that was to come to you, searched intently and with the greatest care, 11 trying to find out the time and circumstances to which the Spirit of Christ in them was pointing when he predicted the sufferings of the Messiah and the glories that would follow. 12 It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves but you, when they spoke of the things that have now been told you by those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven. Even angels long to look into these things."
