First

- What is the main point of each part?
- o How do parts make a whole?
- Can a main point be stated in one word, phrase, image or verse?
- Does it only come from content and/or structure of text as a whole?

Second

- Why do you think this passage was included in this book?
- What could have been the text's purpose or function for original authors and audience?

Third

- What claims did the text make in relation to the audience?
- What response did the author desire?
- How could the text have affected its original audience?

· Then ask these:

- What repeated words, ideas, images may indicate the structure and theme?
 - Is there a dominating idea, metaphor or theme?
- o Does text's structure signify an emphasis? Is it in the center of text?
 - Is an inclusion present?
 - Are there contrasts?
- o Does the beginning or ending of the text contain clues about the main point?
- Are there relationships or connections throughout the text that may reveal the purpose of the text?

HERMENEUTICS & EXEGESIS

- Exegesis comes from Greek word that means "to lead out"
 - Pulling definition OUT of text
 - Involves: study of grammar, study of terminology, identification of author, literary features, study of historical data and theological implications
 - Who, What, When, Where, Why
- · Hermeneutics INVOLVES exegesis, but it is not only that.
 - Hermeneutics is the art and science of interpreting scripture, but
 - o also involves study of techniques and principles
 - Theories, methods, processes, principles
- Exegesis is guided by hermeneutics

GENESIS 7:11-24 (CSB)

11 In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on that day all the sources of the vast watery depths burst open, the floodgates of the sky were opened, 12 and the rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights. 13 On that same day Noah and his three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth, entered the ark, along with Noah's wife and his three sons' wives. 14 They entered it with all the wildlife according to their kinds, all livestock according to their kinds, all the creatures that crawl on the earth according to their kinds, every flying creature—all the birds and every winged creature according to their kinds. 15 Two of every creature that has the breath of life in it came to Noah and entered the ark. 16 Those that entered, male and female of every creature, entered just as God had commanded him.
