CALL TO WORSHIP

The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing.

-Zephaniah 3:17



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1 There were some present at that very time who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And he answered them, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way? 3 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. 4 Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? 5 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish."



6 And he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. 7 And he said to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?' 8 And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. 9 Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

Jesus simply was not in the habit of telling people what they wanted to hear.

1 There were some present at that very time who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.

Everyone knew of the event, but the reason it was mentioned to Jesus is that it was generally believed that victims of calamities and misfortunes were guilty of extraordinary sins that they had kept hidden.



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WE HAVE A TENDENCY TO ASSOCIATE TRAGEDY WITH JUDGMENT
AND FAVOR OR SUCCESS WITH BLESSING (ie Job)

REPENTANCE is the point and a necessity

Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God? Or do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?

Romans 2:3-4





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The great Puritan John Bunyan, a man who lived close to the earth, saw that the caretaker's promise to "dig around it" indicated that its root structure was perhaps earthbound. Bunyan addressed the tree in one of his sermons: "Barren fig-tree! See how the Lord Jesus, by these very words, suggesteth the cause of thy fruitless soul. The things of this world lie too close to thy heart; the earth with its things has bound up thy roots; thou art an earth-bound soul."



Jesus is saying the issue of not bearing fruit is a root issue. What soil are you setting your roots in?

We are the tree
repentance and worship are fruit
Jesus is the caretaker

Repentance = you understand that you are completely wicked and yet completely loved b/c of Christ

The tree was in the vineyard (good soil) and had all the right opportunities to produce good fruit and shade and beauty with the rest of the vineyard.

Paul understood this completely and it was evident in his life, the more Paul repented the more power he walked in.

Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God

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












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
