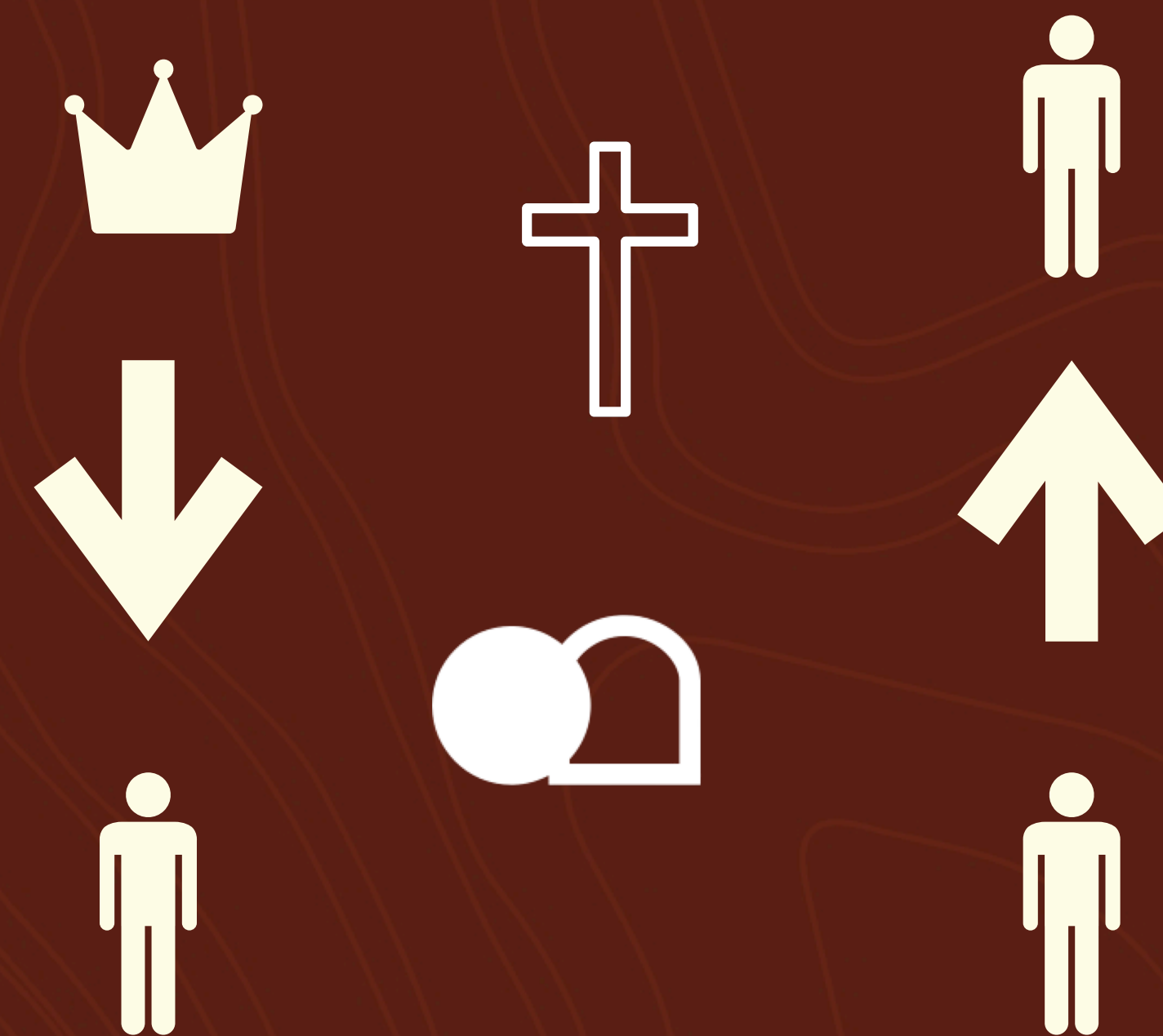
Two Ways To View The Gospel
