What is Hope?

Our Hope is rooted in God's Promises

 4 For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. -Rmns 15:4

Our Hope is rooted in God's Attributes

• For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him. -Ps. 62:5



Hope comes by crucifying our pride & bumbling our Hearts. (v.1)

Pride is instinctive (resides in the Heart)

Pride leads to worldly desires

Pride leads us to arrogance occupy myself with things too great and too marvelous for me.

-Psalm 129:1

"God abhors other sinners but against the proud he professes open defiance & hostility." -Thomas Manton

Natural Humility = We are small creatures; God is great Creator & Sustainer

Moral Humility = We are sinners devoid of moral virtue adequate to stand before God in and of ourselves; God is morally excellent & good — therefore, we are dependent upon Him



Hope comes by resting in God's providence by quieting our souls. (v.2)

2 But I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child is my soul within me.

-Psalm 129:2

How do we quiet our souls?

- Cultivating in self-denial (weaken attachment w/ the world) within ourselves
- Cultivating dependence upon God by recognizing all things are from Him
- · Cultivating contentment & learning to live by what God gives us
