Brilliance of Jesus' counter question:

- 1. If they said his baptism is from Heaven, they would be admitting to them sinning by rejecting his baptism (Jhn. 7:29-30)
- 2. Jesus forced them to take a position on His ministry. If agreed—would have to admit that Jesus was indeed the Messiah that JTB proclaimed (Jhn. 1:29-32)


and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others."

When they heard this, they said, "Surely not!"

The religious leaders wanted the vineyard (God's kingdom), but not the rightful Son. This is the heart of rebellion.

The heart of sin = rejecting the Ruler i.e. "It's my body—I'll do what I want." "It's my money—I earned it." "It's my life—don't tell me how to live it."





JESUS HAS AUTHORITY TO JUDGE AND TO SAVE (VS. 17–18)

17 But he looked directly at them and said, "What then is this Ps. 118:22 = Understood to be Messianic to Jews; Jesus proclaims about Himself that is written: "The stone that the builders rejected has

become the cornerstone'? 18 Everyone who falls on that stone Jesus' authority cannot be ignored or skirted around will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will

crush him."

Jesus claims authority over every facet of our lives:

- 1. Authority over sin (Matt. 9:6)
- 2. Authority over eternal life (Jhn 1:12-13)
- 3. Authority over ALL things (Matt. 28:18)


