- We are seeing how crucial it is to know who you are in Christ and who Christ is in you.
- You will always act out of who you think you are
- You as a Dad
- You don't struggle with believing that your the father

to those kids

- "Lord, You have it in your head, please help me to get it in my heart that I am the parent."
- No, I see myself as the parent and act out of that.
- When you tell them to clean their room, You have
- authority in that area.
- You are just as accepted by the Father as Jesus is.
- You are just as loved by the Father as Jesus is.
- You have the same authority of sickness, disease, poverty, sin—all the works of the devil—as Jesus did
- When we recognize that we are sons and daughters of the King—Princes and Princesses
 of His Kingdom,
- He can live His life through us
- We can spend our inheritance, showing people how good our Dad is
- Part 1: The Old Man is Dead (dead to sin)—God removed the desire to sin from your true self
- Part 2: Why do I do the things I don't want to do? (dead to the law)—the law reminds us that we can't fulfill the law in our own strength
- -Key is to get weaker so we can get stronger
- Christ living His life through us

Today,

I want to look at sin, the flesh and what that means for the believer.

- Galatians 5:16-25
- ¹⁶But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.
- ¹⁷For the <u>desires of the flesh</u> are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against <u>the flesh</u>, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.
- 18But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.
- Galatians 5:16-25
- ¹⁹Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality,
- ²⁰idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions,
- ²¹envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God

- ²²But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,
- ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.
- ²⁴And those who belong to Christ Jesus have <u>crucified the flesh</u> with its passions and desires.
- 25If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit.
- Why would Paul write to a group of born again believers,
- -who were dead to sin, and alive to Christ
- -dead to the law
- And tell them:
- 16But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.
- ¹⁷For the <u>desires of the flesh</u> are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against <u>the flesh</u>, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.
- For the same reason He told the church in Rome, "Do not be conformed to this world; do not let this world squeeze you into it's mold..."
- Because it is possible for people who have all the resources of Christ to not live from those resources
- Paul describes this life as "according to the flesh"
- -and it is completely at odds with the life now available to us that is life "according to the Spirit."
- So, let's go big picture:
- What is the meaning of life?
- -What is the "why" of our being here?
- -Why am I here, what is the point of it all?
- (ILL) Out of the overflow of love between a husband and a wife, they create a child, children, to share that love with.
- We were created by God to enjoy His infinite and limitless love.
- We were made in the "image of God."
- In plain English, that means that we are capable of receiving God's love.
- We don't only have antennas that can pick up God's love,
- -we also have a receiving set;
- -we can actually receive that love.
- God's love can come into us and can dwell within us.
- -We are capable of that and were made able to do that.
- We are not only able to respond to God,
- -but we are able to share that love He places inside of us with others.
- We were created for a relationship with God.
- -We were created to live our lives from him.
- -We were created to "live and move and have our being" in Him.
- So, we are dependent on Him,
- -It is a dependent relationship where He initiates, and He gives the life and the love we live from it.
- -We are dependent creatures in a dependent relationship of love.

- Why am I here?
- To be a receiver of the life of God, to contain His life and to display it and to share it and to become an extension of God in every situation, as I am the steward of this planet.
- So, what I'm talking about is not becoming monks and nuns,
- It is not about being a "holy man";
- When you are out in the "secular world" you are there to live by the life of God and live from the love of God.
- · -That is the meaning of life.
- Sin is primarily not the breaking the rules.
- -For many people that is quite shocking.
- -Then they think of sin they think that if "I should've done this" or "should not have done that".
- Sin is primarily the breaking of a love relationship.
- · We were created to be dependent on God,
- · -drawing from the love of God,
- -living in the love of God which is the life of God.
- · And sin is not the breaking of rules,
- -sin is the breaking of the family relationship.
- It is the breaking away, it is the divorcing of myself from the love of God.
- (ILL) Sin is the wife walking into a restaurant and seeing her husband of 25 years sneaking behind her back and kissing another woman.
- It is the breaking of a relationship. (Covenants!)
- The fall of man, the entrance of sin, was a call to independence.
- -It was the insane attempt of human beings to break relationship with God and to find meaning in themselves instead of in God.
- The temptation of Satan the reader in Genesis 3 was "you shall be as God".
- · Think of this: only God has life in himself.
- -God is self-existent.
- God doesn't get his life from anywhere.
- He is self existent, self-sufficient,
- He is the un-beginning source of all,
- He is the fountain of life and existence.
 - -His life in himself.
- God doesn't have any life, He is life.
- The heart of sin is saying, "I will be just like God is."
- "I will cut myself loose from God, from His wisdom from His love, from His life"
- I can find all the life I need
- -and all the love I need
- -and all the wisdom I need to handle life in myself, just like God.
- I will be self-sufficient, I'll be self-existent, I will handle my life.
- When mankind declared independence from God, our Source, we would become our own meaning.

- -We would have to create our own sense of life rather than get our meaning and source of life in God.
- The problem is we can't.
- -To think we can is a great delusion and lie.
- Let's say we have an electric coffee maker.
- -Let's say that electric coffee maker chose total independence from electricity.
- That is stupid.
- -That is just stupid is the fall of man.
- · If the coffee maker declares independence from electricity, what are you left with?
- -That is not an option with an electric coffee maker.
- The coffee pot can no longer fulfill its meaning.
- It can no longer make coffee.
- Therefore, it's destiny is gone.
- It cannot be what it was made to be.
- What is left with? It's left with a pot.
- -It is perfectly useless because it was specifically fashioned to be a coffee maker.
- In every part of the mechanics that drives it depends on electricity and now it is independent of electricity.
- -So what's left with? A pot.
- -So now it must find meaning in its potness, instead of in the coffee that was created to make.
- And so now all meaning becomes the color of my pot,
- -the size of my pot,
- -the shape of my pot,
- -everything is all about the pot now.
- Some really searched for meaning in the coffee pots, they realize what they are made for they filled themselves with water and coffee.
- But Without electricity, there they sit-- dead, cold and no coffee.
- You get what I'm saying here?
- -The meaning of a coffeemaker's life is coffee.
- -If it is not making coffee then there is no point to its existence.
- When man declared their independence from God, He walked away from his supply of life,
- -He walked away from the source of electricity and so he is left with this container which is in the Scripture is called "flesh."
- And so: we, like the pot, try to find meaning in the container, in our flesh, and in relationships with other pots
- -All that I have left now is the coffee pot, with no electricity.
- The meaning of life is turned inward to this frail week mortal container,
- -which was created to contain and display the will of God,
- -but there is nothing there.
- So, we try to find it in fashion
- -houses,
- · -hobbies,

- -relationships,
- -The newest car,
- -our career
- -Pleasure, fitness, vacations, notoriety,
- -Something has to give me meaning.
- The color, shape and size of our pot.
- Using my flesh for that which God never intended is the essence of sin.
- (ILL) It is like seeing a group of boys using a Stradivarius violin for a baseball bat.
- God used us to play his life and we're using it as a baseball bat.
- And so, mankind feels this strange emptiness,
- -They know that there's no coffee in the pot, but they just can't put their finger on it
- Sin is all the ways in which we substitute the reason for our being here.
- I'm here to be a container for God and to express Him.
- If I substitute another meaning for life,
- -another reason for being here to try and deal with my broken relationship with God, that's sin.
- And it's worse than that, it's death.
- -God said, "in the day that you eat of the tree-- that is, you declare your independence, you shall surely die."
- (ILL) Imagine a renegade branch that decides it wants to abandon the vine with its trunk and deep roots.
- "Who says I have to stay here with the vine? How old fashion and limiting?"
- -And so, the revolt of the branch begins.
- What do we say about this renegade branch?
- -Naughty? It broke the rules?
- No, more like foolish. It is suicide. Idiotic.
- -That branch is destroying itself.
- -It is destroying itself.
- It doesn't matter what kind of spin the branch puts on his new life,
- -how inspiring his marketing campaign is about how great his new life is,
- -he will shrivel up and die.
- -No question.
- That is what Jesus said, sin is like.
- To sin is to turn away from the source of life.
- -To reject one's source of nourishment and meaning and go in one's direction.
- It is to unplug from the source of power and electricity and cease to do what you were created to do.
- Death is the result—of the things that entered this world as a result of sin
- -worry, strife, anger, addictions, sadness, etc.
- What is the meaning of life?
- -Sin decided that the meaning of life is right here, in my flesh; in the coffee pot
- It is finding meaning in all this stuff around me, apart from God.
- We read at the beginning in Galatians 5 about the works of the flesh,
- -that is the many different ways people to find meaning in their flesh.

- Paul begins the list with sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality which means that we look for the meaning for our existence in our glands and organs and senses;
- in our fantasies and imaginations.
- -All of which is a gift of God,
- God gave us a beautiful body with gifts, sexual organs, and senses.
- -He gave us all of that. <u>But we turned</u> it on its head to seek meaning apart from God.
- Idolatry is seeking meaning, life, or happiness in another person or in something that is created,
- -when that can only come from God!
- When I put something else there, I'm saying "that will give me the life." "That will give me the meaning; that will give me the happiness" that God says comes for Him alone.
- Sin is saying "I have to have this person because they will bring meaning to it. I have to own this."
- Or they see something on TV or in a catalog and they say "I've got to have that.
- I can't live without that position in that company
- I must have that degree I can't live without that degree
- I must have that honor.
- I must I must I must. Because that, whatever that is or whoever that is, that will fulfill me give me the meaning my existence.
- Even a worthy goal. Something that is not sin, it could even be a gift of God.
- -I can try and find meaning from that and it becomes sin to me.
- The gift of God on my life, my calling, my position, I'm a teacher.
- -It is a gift of God.
- I can forget it is a gift from God and make it that which I find my meaning;
- -that which gives any my joy that which gives me my life.
- ILL) Wilderness time; realized I got my identity from my position and Gifting;
- -Susie really liked Jesus a lot and was trying to live for Him; in the wilderness she never
 fell out of love with Him, But because of my wrong source of Identity I was mean and
 religious.
- sorcery, which turns away from God to the demonic.
- enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, what is that?
- They are reactions when somebody takes from me what I believe to be the meaning of life.
- Something that I have treasured as my meaning, my purpose, and someone comes along and takes it from me.
- The other prophetic ministers gets a bigger crowd than me.
- -That was my meaning in life, and he took it away from me.
- rivalries, dissensions, divisions, --all the conflicts that arise over what is the meaning of life.
- You have husbands and wives who disagree over what is the most important thing,
- -there is a continual conflict because they are figuring out, "what is the meaning of life?"
- envy, Someone else appears to have found the meaning of life and they are happy.
- -Of Course, we always find someone who seems to have found and I want that.

- -And so we respond with envy
- **drunkenness, orgies,** are Paul's last expressions.
- That is when you get up.
- "Drunkenness" and "orgies" is "forget meaning."
- The meaning of life is become unconsciousness.
- I want to get into oblivion, I want to unfeel, I want to forget.
- -Or I want to just feel pleasure.
- How does this affect believers?
- -You may say, "Yeah, but I'm born again."
- You may have noticed that believers do sin after they are saved.
- For Paul, the "flesh" primarily is describing every part of you—desire, emotion, thought, action—
- everything that is not under the control/influence of the Holy Spirit.
- Your new nature has no desire to sin;
- -But that doesn't mean that your body, soul, emotions, habits are totally renewed.
- -That depends on the renewing of your mind.
- When you were born again, you became dead unto sin,
- -your old man, your sinful nature died and was crucified with Christ.
- The reason you now feel a desire or drawing toward sin is **not** because your old sin nature compels you to sin;
- But you still feel the effects of your old man where your mind is not renewed.
- These affects of the unrenewed mind are what Paul calls your flesh.
- Romans 6:6We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the <u>body of</u> sin might be brought to nothing,
- Paul calls your flesh the "body of sin";
- In Romans 7:24 he calls it this "body of death."
- The picture there is that your sin nature left behind a body,
- -it left behind habits, behaviors, worldviews that are not in line with your new life in Christ.
- -It lives from what it can see, taste, hear, smell and feel rather than the truths of what God's word says and His Spirit is leading us to
- (ILL) It left behind an unrenewed mind that is similar to a computer.
- It was programmed by the old nature to lust, get angry, bitter, greedy;
- -and it will continue to function under the old programming until you renew your mind.
- So, we have all this bad programming,
- -We have an enemy who is lying to us;
- -We have bad teaching, "You are an old sinner, saved by grace. You can't do these things that the Bible says you can do."
- Because of that, we only manifest the life of God to a very limited degree
- -to the degree that we renew our minds.
- Our minds are the limiting factor.
- (ILL) When first learned to drive; conscious of what I was doing—where my hands were, checking the mirrors, effort to keep at the correct speed, smooth turns
- -now it is natural, it is like it is my nature to drive

- -My mind has been reprogrammed to drive naturally
- You can mistakenly think that something that comes so naturally is your nature; truth is that it is a taught, acquired trait.
- The reason we now sin is not because it is our nature and we have no choice (that was true before we were born again),
- -the only thing that forces us to live according to the flesh is the unrenewed mind;
 (Identity)
- -When we act out of the old programming from our old nature
- Not evil on the inside; only reason you lust is you have not programmed your mind.
- This is tremendous—there is no demonic power inside of us that we are warring against, we are set free.
- The only reason I am not manifesting the life of God in every area of my life is not because I am not free,
- -it is because I am ignorant of my freedom, my not is not renewed in that area,
- -I am living according to my flesh in that area.
- Let's take next week and look at what it means to walk in the Spirit,
- -but week's end I want us to see what sin is and what the flesh is so we can recognize
 our capacity for it
- You won't fully understand the Good News of Jesus until you understand what He saved us from.

This week I wanted you to see the subtle ways we can, as believers, live in the flesh.

 -How you live apart from divine influence and seek meaning in people or other created things.
